Naval War College—John Maurer Presentation

DSPS hosted a seminar, "Churchill, Roosevelt, and the Road to Pearl Harbor" presented by Prof John Maurer, a faculty member of the Strategy and Policy Department at the Naval War College in Newport, RI. The presentation was held on Thursday, October 24 at the Noroton Yacht Club. Over 50 DSPS members, friends and members of the NYC attended the presentation and cocktail party following the speech.

Professor Maurer initially spoke about how the US became embroiled in the Second World War, provided anecdotes on the life of Churchill, the relationship between he and Roosevelt, and behind the scenes looks at the war strategy occurring at this time in the Pacific Rim. Prof Maurer then concluded his presentation with his overview on "Sea Power and America's Global Role", covering topics such as issues between China and Japan, piracy on the high seas, and cyber security.

Prof John Maurer is the Alfred Thayer Mahan Professor of Sea Power and Grand Strategy. He is a graduate of Yale University and holds an M.A.L.D. and Ph.D. in International Relations from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University. In addition, he is the author or editor of books examining the outbreak of the First World War, military interventions in the developing world, naval arms control between the two world wars, and a study about Winston Churchill's views on British foreign policy and grand strategy.

At the Naval War College, he teaches a popular elective course on Churchill and grand strategy. He has received both the U.S. Navy's Meritorious Civilian Service Award and Superior Civilian Service Award.
