Top Button Bar:

Officers of DSPS: the Bridge (see column to the right) committees, and appointed positions.

Membership: Information about DSPS and our parent organization (America's Boating Club), including membership benefits and how to become a member.

Links: Marine Safety, Vessel Safety Check, Charts, Weather, and other boating resources.

Gallery: Photographs of DSPS people, places, and events.

Second Button Bar:

Events: Upcoming DSPS events, including Flare/UP!, classes, speaker series, and more.

The Big Gray Text Boxes:

Click on the blue right-pointing chevrons in the lower right corner of each box to go to the indicated page.

The chevrons and the "Info/Registration" button in the "Coastal Boating Competence Course" box go to an information page about our "signature" basic boating course.

The chevrons in the "Courses, Seminars, and Boat Operator Certification (BOC)" box go to the same place as the "Education" button in the Top Button Bar.

The chevrons in the "Upcoming Events" box go to the same place as the "Events" button in the Second Button Bar.

Weather Information Buttons:

Current Weather Buoy Data: The University of Connecticut Department of Marine Sciences Long Island Sound Coastal Observatory provides data from buoys in Long Island Sound, including New London Ledge Light; Central Long Island Sound (about 14 nm SE of New Haven Harbor); the ARTG buoy (north of Smithtown Bay, Long Island); Western Long Island Sound (about 3 miles off Greenwich); and Execution Rocks. Data includes wind speed and direction, air temperature and humidity, barometric pressure, dew point, and apparent temperature. The Central and Western LIS buoys also have wave data. A map showing the approximate locations of these buoys is here.

NOAA Zone Forecast: This page includes links to several local marine weather forecast products, including the current and 7-day forecast for Long Island Sound west of New Haven / Port Jefferson.

NOAA Tide Predictions: Tide prediction at Long Neck Point, Darien, for today and tomorrow.

Radar of the Area/Region: Current Weather Underground weather radar map.

Buttons At The Bottom:

In addition to the various legal notices, the buttons at the bottom of the home page will take you to the USPS "Stargazer" guide to the night sky, the USPS home page for members and the America's Boating Club home page for the general public, the District 2 website, and the DSPS Facebook page.
